His interests include the development of Teledermatology to increase access to specialized skincare for underserved people in Rwanda, as well as seeing patients at Butaro Hospital in between clinical visits, leadership skills, grant writing, research in dermatologiedemiology and the establishment and maintenance of community outreach programs. He is fluent in Kinyarwanda (his mother tongue), French, and English.
